

Canton Trail System Overview

The development of Canton's trail system began over ten years ago, as a result of community input identifying open space and trails as one of Canton's most desired amenities.

The Fellows Creek Wetland Nature Trail at Flodin Park was the first phase of this Canton Trail System and runs one-third of a mile in length.

The next phase of trail development was constructed along the Lower Rouge River on Wayne County property. This section of trail, approximately four miles in length, currently interconnects Canton's Heritage Park with Michigan Department of Transportation's I-275 Metro Trail (a regional trail system offering approximately six miles of non-motorized pathways in Canton). The trailhead for the Lower Rouge Trail is located off of Morton-Taylor Road, north of Michigan Avenue.

The most recent phase of trail development was constructed on the International Transmission Company (ITC) corridor. This section of trail is approximately 3 miles long and runs through the ITC power line corridor and connects the Lower Rouge Trail to both Flodin Park and Griffin Park.

Combined, these trails in Canton offer nearly 15 miles of non-motorized pathways, open year-round from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m.

This multi-use trail system provides many benefits to our community, including: underground public utility access for Canton Municipal Services staff; neighborhood connectivity to many local streets and sidewalks; and outdoor recreational opportunities for residents and visitors.

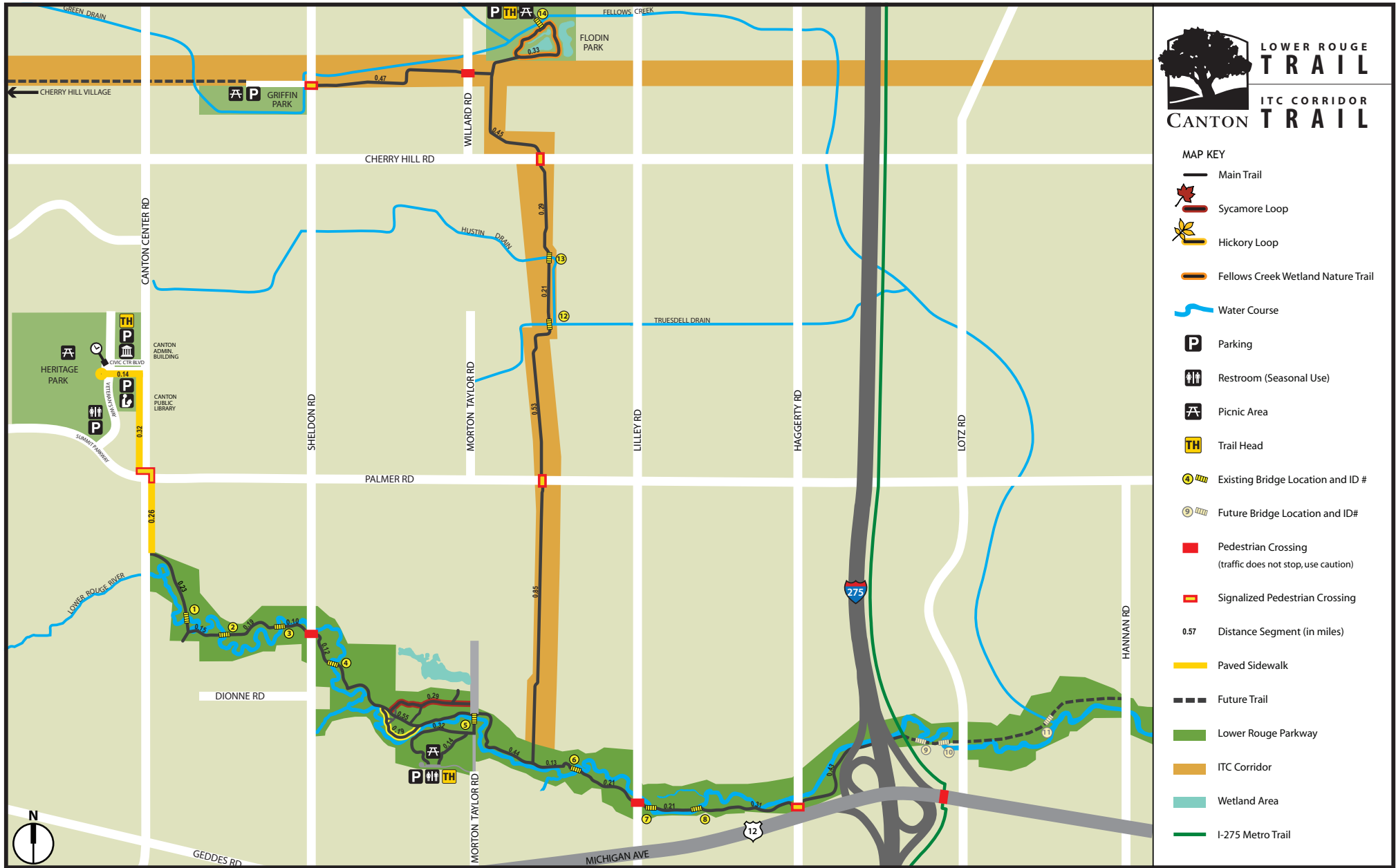


TRAIL MAP

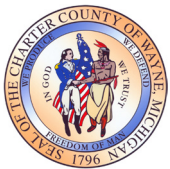
